Information Letter California Proposition

Dear business partners,

The California Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, commonly known as California Proposition 65, requires companies to warn consumers about potential exposure to chemicals that the state of California has identified as carcinogenic, toxic to reproduction, or otherwise harmful to health. The list now includes nearly 1,000 substances and is updated regularly.

For some of these substances, there are exposure limits (safe harbour levels) below which no warnings are required. However, these limits refer to daily exposure (mg/day) and not to concentrations in materials. Assessing actual exposure is extremely complex for manufacturers of technical products and, in practice, is only possible through extensive, substance-specific analyses.

Due to the large number of listed substances, the complexity of polymeric materials and ubiquitous environmental pollution, it cannot be ruled out that traces of individual substances from the Proposition 65 list may be present in our materials. A complete analytical review of all listed substances is not technically or economically feasible.

For these reasons, we **cannot provide comprehensive confirmation of compliance with California Proposition 65.**
